


Hart Park Improvement Plan How we got here






Existing Amenities

- Kern River Nature Park





Kern River Nature Park

Nature Park - is designation for a protected landscape by means of long-term planning and sustainable use that promotes tourism and community use. Nature Reconnection – provides places to see and experience the natural world as an response to 24/7 technology while engaging the public beyond just looking.


